Image of God:

Genesis 1:26-27 says,

"Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock and all the wild animals, and over all the creatures that move along the ground." 27 So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them."

What does it mean to be created in the image of God? Scholars refer to it as "imago Dei" or image of God. In the scriptures, the idea of "image" carries one of two different ideas. First, that the item created is identical to the original image (being of the same kind). Second, that the item created is like the original image (being a shadow or similar to the original kind). The Hebrew has two different words used in these definitions. However, it becomes difficult in translation because early Christians and Jews intermixed these words as they brought the Hebrew into Greek in the New Testament. Genesis 5:1-3 does this in early translations. (When Adam has sons) Again, it happens in Genesis 9:6 when Noah is commanded not to kill because man is made in the image of God. We are limited in our understanding due in part to our inability to completely grasp the original language and the use of the language.

Even still, there are some important things we can derive from the text. John MacArthur's Bible Commentary points out that we can see the plurality of the God head in this text. We can see that God is One and Three at the same time. "Let US," said God. There we see the beginning of the doctrine of the Trinity showing up here in this verse. We can also identify the personal connection that God has with the creation of man. God intimately forms him from the dust; whereas, the other creatures were formed with a spoken word. God takes the time to form this creature to be "like" himself and makes man "plural" at the same time. We see that He created both MAN and WOMAN. He specifically forms man so that he exists within relationship... just "like" the Godhead.

Man was also created "like" God in the sense that he had a will, intellect and emotion. At first, man was also good and sinless. But man was never created as a deity. Man was the creation, and God was the creator. This difference is attacked by Satan in the Garden in Genesis 3:5 "For God knows that when you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like







FISHING OR GOD LET'S D-BAIT

If the question is fishing or God? The answer is relatively easy for the Bible tells us that we are to have no other god's before us and to seek first the Kingdom of God.

If the question is—fishing for men or God? The Answer appears to be more complex, perhaps. As I wrestled with that question, it seemed to me that fishing for men was a part of what being a Christian is about for Jesus said, “Come be my disciples, and I will show you how to fish for people”. As I pondered, I concluded that in order to fish for men properly, one had to put God and his perfect will first. In other words, the bait and presentation must be according to that sovereign will.

The third aspect of this church sign is the play on words. As presented let's d-bait reads, we need to take the bait off our hook and get into a right relationship with God. We can't proceed without reliance upon the Holy Sprit for he draws men unto himself.

In its pure form the sign is asking for a discussion of the main question. Do we fish or do we seek God. I believe the answer is clear. How do you interpret the sign?

Let's seek God and then let's go fishing with his direction for completing the task.

Maybe we need to cast our net on the other side of the boat!

God, knowing good and evil.” Whether it was a satanic ploy to convince Adam to ascend to the level of deity, or to cause Adam to forget the idea that he was already “in the image of God,” this great temptation hinged upon an attack on the “image of God” within man. Since that time until today, man continues to strive to “be like God.” It lies within the core of our sinful nature. We often ignore God and think we are good enough on our own. We say to God, “we don’t need you,” or “we are just as good as you.”

The Apostle Paul says a few important things about the image of God. 1 Cor. 11:7 points to man still being the image and glory of God. But Paul takes us a little deeper in Christ. 2 Cor. 4:4 says, “The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.” Jesus himself is the true image of God. 1 Cor. 15:49 encourages us that we will become like Christ. “And just as we have borne the image of the earthly man, so shall we bear the image of the heavenly man.”

I believe this is more than just a future event. To bear the image of Christ is also a daily event. We become more of “imago Dei” the more we become more like Christ. Yes, there are elements inherent within being human, but what God aspires for us to be is more like Christ. Part of being more like Christ is seeing the “imago Dei” in others as well. When we see others as created in the image of God, we are less inclined to take advantage of them, mistreat them, covet them, commit adultery in our minds, and we are MORE inclined to love them as Christ did.
