Barometers or Batteries

"Grace does not free the Christian from living according to God's will; rather, it makes it possible for one to live according to God's will." – John Sailhamer

In studying Romans 8, we find that Paul is encouraging the believer to understand how Christ's death frees the believer to please God. Because Christ gave us the Spirit, we are now able to live life to the full. Paul says in verse 4, **"He condemned sin in the flesh, in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk NOT according to the flesh but who LIVE according to the Spirit."** The encouragement we have is to live lives that are not governed by our flesh – or its desires. Rather, we are to live lives that are empowered by the Spirit of God.

Although we understand this truth, there is a little problem that can arise if we are not careful. Sometimes we believe that we are fulfilling the requirements of the Law by living according to the Spirit and we think of it as a sliding scale. In other words, we begin to create a standard of achievement that uses the **"Flesh"** and the **"Spirit"** as the measuring tools. Just like the barometric pressure gauge hanging on the wall of a weather station that has **"HIGH"** and **"LOW"** pressure listed on the gauge, we create our own gauge that has **"FLESH"** on one side and **"SPIRIT"** on the other side. We diligently try to live with the arrow pointed to **"SPIRIT."** However, this isn't what Paul is teaching us here. It isn't a matter of trying to live a **"SPIRIT"** life or be **"in the Spirit."** Rather he is pointing to a source of power. It is deeper than how much Spirit I am living in today... or how much of my Flesh was visible today.

Rather than thinking of the barometer with the two sides. Consider this illustration instead: I had an old radio that ran on either a wall-plug or 4 D batteries. I remember this old radio outside at the beach. It would play music for an hour or two and then it would die. **The batteries wouldn't be able to power the radio to keep running.** They would fail all the time. However, if I would plug that radio into the wall at home, it would play and play and play. Sailhamer writes: **"The law's requirement will be fulfilled by our relying on the Spirit's power, instead of the flesh."** It is like the radio and the batteries. **Relying on the batteries to please God doesn't work. They are incapable of doing what is required.** Sure, we might fake it for a little bit, but the end is the same: failure. However, by trusting the Spirit and relying on the Spirit to lead us, we begin to walk the road of pleasing God – the road of sanctification.

It isn't about living a life where the Spirit wins more than the Flesh wins in us; rather, it is about a complete abandonment of Flesh. It is about dying to our Flesh and LIVING IN THE SPIRIT. As the believer continues to walk down the road of sanctification, we start by asking "God what do you want in this situation"? If we are honest, we will feel our desires pulling us away from what God wants at times. But we continue to die to those desires. It is the slow process of crucifixion of the Flesh. It doesn't want to die. It may hang on the cross yelling at us, jeering us, taunting us. But the Flesh must stay on the cross and we are to walk in communion with the Spirit. Slowly, we move from that first question of "What God wants of me", to a statement, "Empower me as I do your will as I stay plugged into you".
