Erosion Pastor Justin



I recently drove by my favorite childhood swimming spot on Lake Superior. It is a beautiful spot. A lazy river drifts into the lake, a peculiar blend of warm inland water and the icy waters of Superior. It has been almost 25 years since I last swam there, and it has changed dramatically. The waves of the great lake have washed away the spot where we used to put our chairs. The currents from the waters changed the shape of the shoreline. The small river mouth has widened. In my memories, I can think of a time I could jump into the middle of it ... but not now.

Life changes all around us. Sometimes, it seems to change for the better, other times not so much. We call the change for the good, "progress". My car doesn't need to be repaired when I take 300-mile trips – progress. The gas mileage of the truck doubles from 40 years prior – progress. Roads widen to make them safer – progress. But what do we call it when the opposite happens? What do we call it when we stop doing the things we once did that made us successful or helped us to grow?

It is common to see negative change happen in organizations and in our personal life. A business, which once was wildly successful, begins to fade and drift into the red. A relationship that once was strong and vibrant has drifted into indifference and disconnectedness. Even our relationship with our heavenly Father, which once was thriving and enjoyable, might have drifted into emptiness and obscurity. What might we call it? Backsliding? That might be too harsh. Backsliding often carries with it the idea of turning away on purpose. Negligence? Again, that might be too negative. Negligence has more of a purposeful intent.

Like the shore of Superior, one artist called this change to the negative a "slow fade". That might capture it well. An unintended drift from a positive relationship into a neutral or negative situation resulting from complacency – that would be a "slow fade". My favorite swimming spot didn't change overnight. It took years and years of forces to change.

Business executives pay counselors large sums of money to come in and evaluate their companies to find out "what went wrong." Husbands and wives might seek professional help to find out how the slow fade crept into their relationship. Churches die

and leave people wondering, “What happened”? In almost every one of these situations, the most common error that occurs is that each one stopped doing what made the relationship great at first.

Business people, who once had orders up to their ears, stop pursuing new customers. Husbands and wives stop dating each other and caring for each other’s needs like they did early in their relationships. Christians stop having their quiet times and running to God with their daily needs in prayer. By ignoring what made the situation move forward in progress and neglecting daily diligence, we begin to enter into the “slow fade.” The principle for application is that we must continue to build upon the foundations we established when life was progressing. Don’t forget to do what made it good early on.

Even Jesus shared similar words with the Church in Ephesus in Revelation 2:4. “Yet, I hold this against you: You have forsaken your first love.”

Don’t forget your first love. If you are wondering why things are not going well, why the shores of life are eroded away, consider the slow fade. Then get back to doing what it was that made it great in the past. Don’t forget who you are, and do what you did earlier.
