GOOD BYE JIM

We are saddened by the recent passing of our friend and brother, Jim Gorman. Jim dropped in at the church one afternoon years ago while we were having a deacon meeting in the fellowship hall. I gave him a quick tour of our new addition. He attended services the next Sunday and was a part of our church family from then on. To Jim, it was like "coming home". After John Weiberg died, Jim took over our Adult Sunday School class. We appreciated his transparency, and his sense of humor.

Jim shared his testimony with his Sunday School class. He grew up under humble circumstances on a northern Minnesota farm. He also worked as a logger before he was ready to answer the call and go off to Bible school. He served churches under an organization called "Village Missions". His first church was in California, then it was on to Nebraska and Minnesota.

Jim endured a lot of disappointment and heartache, especially in his later years. He was glad to find a special friend, in Olga. They made a great pair, walking into Sunday Night Live hand in hand.

About once each month, Jim and I would meet at Subway for a sandwich. We had some great visits. I will miss those visits a lot. The last time we met, Jim seemed to be preoccupied with the prospect of death. He had contracted some sort of blood disease for which there is no cure. He was looking forward to "going home", not wanting to succumb to dementia, and not wanting to be confined to any nursing home. Those wishes were granted. Jim is now safe at home with his Heavenly Father.

Jim Gorman was a humble man, a bit shy especially in one on one situations. All this shyness vanished when Jim got up to preach or teach his Sunday School class. His jokes would keep us in stitches.

Wood carving was Jim's passion. His little apartment was lined with dozens of examples of his work. I have a couple of examples which I will always treasure.

One of Jim's favorite sayings went like this, "I'm not afraid of death, I just don't want to be around when it happens". A few days ago, he was around, and it did happen. But as the Apostle Paul tells us, "to be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord. So long for now, Jim. We'll be seeing you again soon!"

Lots of fun to spend the day with the ladies. Join us for the day! Bring a sack lunch and stay as long as you can to work on these projects.



Mission Updates —

Kaylee Tracy of Reach Global—Kaylee, from Osceola, WI joined Reach Global with the EFCA to serve in Berlin Germany. Our Mission Board recommends we take on support for Kaylee starting in January 2020 for \$420 for the year.

Kaylee will spend her first year in Berlin focusing on language learning and building relationships. She will work in a refugee camp to mentor the kids as they are processing through identity, trauma and integration. She will be working alongside a pastor and his wife thorough a German Free Church.

Germany accepted over 1 million refugees since 2015, most of whom are from the Middle East. Kaylee's dream is that these people experience Christ for the first time and that the city be transformed and the local church be more engaged with this community.

Berry Anderson

Navigators—the Longs—Navigators is a worldwide organization to reach college students with the gospel, disciple them and train them to reach other students. They are finding teens today have more **depression, suicide, drug issues and fear the future. They don't want to get a job, communicate verbally or become independent.** The constant use of social media and playing video games makes for a greater challenge to win them to Christ.

In the fall they do a survey of incoming freshmen to determine who is willing to come to a Bible Study. They go two by two to the campus and strike up conversations. This year, they are trying to go to other Twin City colleges where there is as yet no Bible studies.

There are 11 full-time staff at the University of Minnesota. The goal for navigators is to reach one million students worldwide by 2030. Trevor did 1:1 discipling with Clay who has now started a small group himself. Cassie met weekly with Kristin who now has four women in her small group.

Trevor and Cassie live with their four young children in a not-so-safe neighborhood in North Minneapolis. Pray for their safety as well as their large shortage of financial support.

Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF)— CEF is a worldwide organization to reach children with the gospel of Christ. The majority of people come to Christ by their teens. It was started in 1937.

Bill Stirrat finished a 12 week course in Children's Ministries and is on the local staff in the St. Croix Valley. Lisa Inlow recently resigned. Pray for a replacement for her. Thousands of dollars are needed for their financial audit, missionary support and materials for Good News Clubs and Five Day Clubs.

Nine people participated in Verse-A-Thon. They memorized enough verses to raise \$4,000 for our local chapter. Currently after school clubs meet in Amery, Turtle Lake, Unity, Luck and Baldwin. Plans are to start clubs in Osceola and Barron schools. Pray for more volunteers. People from our church have been involved with CEF. These include Odrey and Alona Rasmussen, Linda Bibeau and Claudine, Makaila and Alice Brown.

In February the Winter Retreat will invite teens interested in becoming leaders in next summers Five Day Clubs.
