The Virtual Reality
Pastor Justin



From virtual doctor's appointments, to virtual sales calls, to online meetings with coworkers, and facetime chats with friends, the world around us has changed so quickly over the past few weeks. Most of this was available to us prior to the modern crisis. But, who would have imagined it impacting our lives so much. I **never liked the idea of "online" church services, but they seem to be reaching more people than I would have ever imagined.** Local churches, that normally have 110-130 people in a church service are now having 600 people tune in to listen to what the pastor has to say. **However, large churches that had 1000's of people in attendance seem to have 100's in their virtual services.** The landscape of human interaction is changing. Things will never be the same again.

Has this ever happened before? Yes. But it didn't happen this quickly. There was a time in the past when telephones and televisions didn't exist. All communication was done face to face or in print. News traveled slow. Some individuals did not want to talk on the phone. They felt it was too impersonal. Others did not want to invite the Television into their homes. It would be too distracting. But today, it is hard to imagine life without either of these. And, we have grown accustomed to having phone conversations.

With changes like this, we can ask a moral question of the change, **"Is this 'right' for us to participate with?"** First, you must define "right". Right would have to be something that aligns with the moral character of God and doesn't violate the precepts that He has given us to live by. These changes we see are "right" by this definition. They are not sins against God. We may not "personally" like the changes, but they are neither "right" nor "wrong". They are different. These changes are "amoral." They don't have a morality about them.

For my biblical scholars out there, Hebrews 10 does talk about **"Not giving up meeting as some are in the habit of doing"**. We must also keep in mind that the author did not imagine one hour

services held in special buildings once a week. He was probably thinking more about maintaining fellowship with other believers within your town as they would continually meet throughout the week at each **other's houses. The point of the verse is to encourage fellowship with one another not to mandate attendance at a church building.** We must continue in fellowship with one another, regardless of if it is at a building, over the computer, a phone call or even a letter.

Think of the invention of the printing press back in the 15th century. There were individuals who did not like this new machine. It removed the artistic form of writing books. It made more knowledge available to more people. It became a tool that was used to pass the word of God on to the general population. It made it possible for many people to know God and grow in him. Though, some did not like it, it became the means by which God spurred His people to great revival.

So, what does this mean for you and me?

We may not like some of these changes. But many of these changes are going to be part of our lives forever. Phones are not going away. Computers are not going away. The internet is not going away. Televisions are not going away. Rather than scorning the devices, how might we incorporate them into greater glory for God?

They can be frustrating to learn... just like driving a modern car... or processing your social security changes online... or applying for a job online... or even shopping online... there is a learning curve. If you keep in mind that "everything you do, you are doing as unto the Lord" you will find His strength encouraging you to keep going and keep learning. Trust in Him, don't lean on your own understanding, but acknowledge Him and He will make your paths straight.

Mission Updates — Forest Lakes District

Our church is part of the Forest Lakes District of the Evangelical Church of America. There are 138 churches in this district. This organization exists to strengthen pastors and local churches.

A fall conference was held in Madison with over 50 churches represented.

The youth conference in January was held in Green Bay. Over 4,500 were in attendance and about 20 people from our Apple River Community Church attended.

They also hold marriage retreats, workshops for youth pastors, and have training and resource materials for pastors.

Rob and Nancy Weise have served for 16 years in the Forest Lake District. They raise their own support. They are short \$300/month. Pray this need is met.

Mighty to Save

Dr. Kent Brantly, a U.S. medical missionary who contracted the Ebola virus in 2014 in Liberia, credits a “mighty God” – and lots of prayers – for his survival. After recovering from the disease, Brantly returned to the North Carolina headquarters of Samaritan’s Purse, the group he’d been working with in Africa.

He spoke about Deuteronomy 6, saying it’s important to remind others of God’s acts. “I will never grow tired of talking of this,” Brantly said. “I’m going to keep telling my story so I can remember what God has done in my life.”

Then Brantly offered this challenge: “Never think you’re just a normal person. If you’re pursuing God’s calling in your life, he will use you. Even if it’s a challenging calling, even if you find yourself in difficult circumstances, he will give you what you need to be faithful to him, even if it’s a whole army of people praying for you. Share your story over and over and over so you can remember we serve a mighty God.”
