failures, than successes, than what other people think or say or do. It is more important than appearance, giftedness or skill. It will make or break a company...a church...a home. The remarkable thing is we have a choice every day regarding the attitude we will embrace for that day. We cannot change our past...we cannot change the fact that people will act in a certain way. We cannot change the inevitable. The only thing we can do is play on the one string we have, and that is our attitude...I am convinced that life is 10% what happens to me and 90% how I react to it. And so it is with you...we are in charge of our attitudes.”

As I look around at the “changes” around us, they do comprise less than the 10% Swindoll talked about. So what... you put a mask on to go into a store? You have a temperature check before going to the Indy 500... honestly, what is happening? Nothing. Individuals have been neglecting their own health for a long time and this just adds a level of accountability to health.

The problem we have is in the 90% category. We make assumptions that masks lead to human tracking, which leads to government oversight, which leads to vaccinations, which lead to implantations, which lead to cashless societies, which lead to the mark of the beast, which leads to ____ (fill in the blank with whatever you want.) The Bible tells us how this story ends. Things will get bad; then, things will get worse. Finally, Jesus comes and takes us home. That’s not so bad.

When we dwell in the “what if” categories of worry, we get side tracked from our true purpose. We are to show the world CHRIST. We are to display Christ’s love. We are to love one another. We are to cast our mind upon Christ and where He is.



Mission Update — A letter from the Beathams, our August Mission of the Month

Hello, ARCC family!

We are doing well, PTL! We are healthy and able to live in our home in Teco, which is about 1.5 hours from the village. Teco has been our home for over six years and we feel very comfortable here. There are rumors of cases of CoVid-19 here, but we have not experienced people’s lives being affected and so business (for our Mexican neighbors) seems to go on as usual.

Because of Covid-19, we have not been able to travel – neither to the village nor to Mitla for workshops, and we’ve had to make adjustments in our work here to keep the appropriate distances. Bruce has been working from home and Valentin works at the office a few blocks away. Ernesto moved back to his village to live with his family while isolating and works only very part-time with all of the distractions of being at home and supporting his family. He has not been able to continue with the youth or children’s ministries there during this time of restrictions but feels God is using him to live out his faith daily so people can see what God’s people are like! Pray his family will come to know Christ as this is his (and our!) prayer for them.

So, we’ve discovered that it is true that necessity is the mother of invention. We moved the workshops we offer as SIL in Mexico online! While doing this has been a challenge for some of our indigenous co-workers who don’t have consistent internet or own a computer, this has been a blessing for others who would not have been able to travel to Mitla for these workshops and can now ‘attend’ online! Right now Bruce is helping teach an online workshop to help people distribute literacy materials in apps that can be used on smart phones. He is working with students and other staff members from various parts of Mexico, Peru, Colombia, Argentina, Germany and even from the US! Instead of cramming into one busy week all kinds of information as to how to produce literacy materials digitally, they are spreading it out over four weeks and giving the students homework to do throughout that time. This will probably help the students digest more of the information which will help them to apply it better in the future!

Restrictions for traveling to the villages has also caused Bruce and others to think about how we can ‘village check’ our translated Scriptures without being together in person. WhatsApp is big here in Mexico, and Bruce, Valentin and Ernesto (from Yellow Oak) as well as Yuyu and her mom, Teresa (from Coicoyán) all ‘meet’ over WhatsApp at least once a week to continue to check God’s Word! Please pray for good connections from four locations so they can hear each other clearly and that God’s Word can be prepared to be used by a people who are lost without Christ! Bruce also investigated and started using a program called *Scripture Forge* to utilize while they are checking. It allows the users to see the text, hear a recording of that text AND a recording of comprehension questions and allows them to respond with their comments. We pray this can be used for speakers of Mixtec in the diaspora as well – people who live outside this community. We’ve shared the link to this online tool with others to get their suggestions about how to make the Scriptures natural, clear and accurate in the Mixtec language! We pray that more will respond and join in the process!

On the family front, Jeremiah and Abbie celebrated two years of marriage in June! Though Jeremiah lost his job due to Covid, he is looking for other opportunities and is getting more training in the meantime. Abbie continues as a nurse and though she has seen patients with Covid, God has protected her from getting it. Nathaniel continues to serve in the US Marine Corp in Japan and co-leads a Bible study as well as worship on Wednesday or Sundays. Benjamin has multiple jobs this summer (PTL!) to help pay for LeTourneau University this fall. This is his second year there but he’ll be going in as a junior. Pray he can live on campus again as he doesn’t relish the thought of doing classes online. Abby is with us and is memorizing passages of the Bible this summer as well as reading and keeping up with her guitar. She is bored but thankful that our Pastor and family are back from the US so she has at least some friends with whom she can hang out in person (from a distance, supposedly!)

We are very grateful for you and your loving prayers and support. We can do what we do because you allow God to use you to keep us here!

After getting too close to a candle, a vicar in England had to pause to extinguish flames from his sweater. And several preachers appeared on screen with cartoon-like features after inadvertently turning on social media filters.

“This wasn’t planned,” wrote the pastor about the falling ficus, which didn’t cause injury but quickly went viral. “But God used it to bring laughter to the hearts of many. For that, we are thankful.”
