Christmas Songs

Pastor Justin

Hark! The Herald Angels Sing #277, Good Christian
Men Rejoice #273, The First Noel #265, I love these
Christmas songs and many others. There are so many memories, joy,
fondness and hope that these songs cause to rise from my inner being.
Maybe you feel the same way too. Can you picture yourself singing a
great number of these Christmas songs with friends and family members
that are no longer with us? I feel like I can.

The feelings go further than just the songs in the hymnal. Don't you get
the same feelings and joy when you sing things like, "I'll Be Home for
Christmas," or "I'm Dreaming of a White Christmas?" If we are honest,
many of the feelings and emotions that are in these "secular" Christmas
tunes are also the same feelings and thoughts we have about the ones in
the hymnal. So, what makes one "qualified" to sing in church and an-
other "not qualified?" Why would we sing Angels, from the Realms of
Glory #259 and not sing "Jingle Bells?" What makes one acceptable and
the other unacceptable?

The answer to the question is not as simple as you might think. If we
simply say that one speaks of the biblical perspective of Christmas and
the other a secular perspective, what does that mean? Let's consider the
song, We Three Kings #288 in the hymnal. In this song, we have an ac-
count of the three wise men traveling to see Jesus. They sing of their
gifts, gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The chorus focuses upon the star
they are following. The song evokes emotions within us. We can remem-
ber Christmas pageants that we have participated in. We can think of
caroling with friends. It is story in the Bible... but is it really much dif-
ferent than singing "Here Comes Santa Claus?"

Sure there is--- at least we think at first. But, in each song, there is only
one major reference to God and his plan for us. We Three Kings – in the
final verse – says, "Behold Him arise, King and God and Sacrifice." In the
rest of the song... singing about the gifts and the star. In "Here Comes
Santa Claus" the second verse says, "Santa knows that we're all God's
children if we just follow the Light." Again... one time in the whole song.
So, why is one "ok" to sing in Church and the other is not?

The deeper answer is this, songs sung in church should exclaim glory,
honor and worship the God we serve. As such, it seems that some of the
Christmas songs that we love, and even sing in the church, probably
shouldn't get sung within the context of a time of worship. Even though

December Mission of the Month — Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF)

Our church supports the St. Croix District Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF). Bill Stirrat is the field missionary. Alice Brown works with him part time. They train teenagers and adults to teach 5-Day Clubs, Good News Clubs and to become Sunday School teachers. Some teaching is by Zoom and some in the classroom.

5-Day Clubs met this summer in small groups outdoors. There were 19 clubs. 236 children heard gospel and Bible lessons and 2 decisions were made for Christ.

Verse-a-Thon is a program where individuals make pledges, learn Bible verses and give the money to CEF.

Good News Clubs are an after school program to evangelize students and train them in the Bible. They cannot meet in the school now, but are transported to a home or local church. 143 children are enrolled. 19 decisions for salvation have been made. Clubs are in Unity, Clear Lake, Amery, Baldwin, Luck, Osceola and Barron. CEF directors work worldwide in many countries. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, much of their work is being done by Skype and email rather than world travel.

Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath is a symbol of watchfulness and increasing joy as we anticipate Jesus' birth. The wreath's circular shape symbolizes eternity, or life without end. The candles remind us that Jesus is the Light of the World — he brought light and life to a dark world (see John 1:4-5). On each of the four Sundays of Advent, we light a new candle. As the light grows, so does our hope and joy.



Look forward to the Sundays of Advent as each Sunday will focus on one of the Advent themes of HOPE,
