## The Church of Jesus and the Government

Recently, I was reading a section of a book by Wayne Grudem, an evangelical theologian. He had some good words I would like to share with you about how the Church and the Government should relate to one another. Through the past year, we have felt the infringement of government policies in all areas of our lives. We are **left asking questions of “What authority of Government in the life of the Church?” and “What is the role of the Church in the sphere of the Government?”**

Starting with a basic thought will help clarify our thoughts on the subject. We start by acknowledging the concept that Jesus taught in John 18:35 that His kingdom is NOT of this world. Jesus explains that if it were of this world, his servants would rise up and fight. We believe Jesus to be telling us that the Kingdom of Heaven is not to be found on the earth during this time. There will come a time in the future, when the Kingdom will come down to Earth and the Lamb of God will wage war. But, that is not now. That is also not our job to fight that battle. God will do what God will do, when God wills it to be done. For now, the church is an embassy of Heaven through which God makes His appeal to all humankind. We are Ambassadors of this divine embassy.

**Del Tackett, who led the “Truth Project” videos, said that the church and the state govern two separate “spheres” of influence within the world as we know it. These spheres have clearly defined borders and do not have authority over one another. We can look at the Anglican Church of England and the Queen/Parliament as a bad example of this. In that setting, the Queen and the Parliament have authority over all that the Anglican Church teaches and who sits in leadership of the church. This doesn't fit with Jesus' idea of the role of His church in the world. Nor, would the practice of the Catholic church of the Middle Ages, which held power to appoint kings, queens and rulers over the lands that the church presided over. Matthew 22:21 teaches us that we are to give to Caesar those things that belong to Caesar. It isn't the battle of the church to fight. We operate on two different playing fields.**

But, the Church is to stand and fight is for the freedom of people to worship as they see fit. This thought is scary in the modern world. Jesus, as he is walking with the disciples through the Samaritan towns, reached a place where a village would not receive Him. The disciples turned to Jesus and asked if they should call down fire from heaven to consume the town. Jesus strongly rebukes them. He goes on to say,

Jesus strongly rebukes them. He goes on to say, "The Son of Man did not come to condemn the world but that the world might be saved through him." Jesus seems to stand with the idea that men can worship as they see fit. Yahweh will sort it all out in the end. I think Jesus would be appalled with the idea that we would try to use force to convert people to Christianity, as the Catholic church did in the Crusades. It doesn't fit with the ministry of Jesus. He would never force people to convert as is popular in Muslim, Buddhist and Hindu countries today.

Grudem says, "The civil government should not enforce laws requiring or prohibiting kinds of church doctrine, or abridging the people's freedom to worship as they chose." In other words, we need to be ok with people choosing to follow false religions and even defend their right to do so. The basis for this idea is the sovereignty of God and his omnipotent power. God is able to defend Himself. Revelation teaches us that Yahweh wins in the end. Christianity is able to defend itself in the arena of public opinion and holds up well against the attacks of false teachers. We do not need to fear those who would seek to destroy Jesus' teaching. Rather, we should seek the freedom to worship as Christ has called us. The only way to do this is to seek the freedom for all humankind to worship as they see fit as well.

I want to encourage you to keep the Church separate from the Government. We cannot legislate morality to the people of this country. True morality, doing what is right, only comes from Christ changing our hearts. Only when Jesus is enthroned in our hearts and minds can we live out lives that please him. As a country, we can "act" like a Christian country by forcing people to "act" like Christians. But that doesn't mean a country is Christian, it just means we are good at acting like one. Only when we bend our will to be obedient to Christ, have changed hearts, flee from wickedness and pursue Christ's lordship in all areas of our lives would we ever be a Christian nation. But, that will also require us to abandon our Republic form of government for a Theocracy where Yahweh is ruling all will that happen. In the meantime, we seek the freedom for all to worship as they see fit and trust the rest to God.

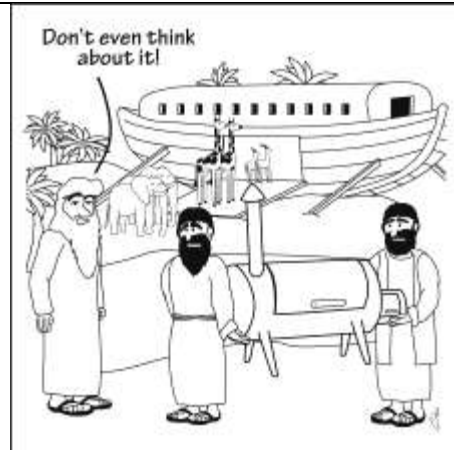
