The Church and Business

Everyday I get one phone call from Google asking me to update my business listing. I hang up as soon as I can; however, every now and then a person catches me on the phone. Mustering up patience, I ask them, "Which business are you calling in reference to?" Some respond with, "Apple River Community Church," others say "Leadmasters" (my lead-paint company), and still others reference "E-Z-Quote" (an old website I had started). In the eyes of the world, the church looks the same as any other "business" out there. But what is similar or different between a church and a business?

The American world sees the church and a business as "An organization or enterprising entity engaged in commercial, industrial, or professional activities. Businesses can be for-profit entities or they can be non-profit organizations that operate to fulfill a charitable mission or further a social cause." (www.investopedia.com/terms) The church is often seen as a poorly run business that is on the edge of bankruptcy because of its "kindheartedness." There is little distinction between a church, a homeless shelter, the Rotary Club, or a networking organization. These groups are viewed as places where people give money for the benefit of others.

Our federal and state designations lump the church into these same categories through 501-C3 status. Tax breaks, donation accounting, and special considerations for "public good" provided by non-profit organizations cause the church to be considered the same as all other non-profit businesses. It is valuable to understand that the world around us sees the church in such light – as a non-profit business. This helps us understand what the world expects when it engages with the church. It also helps us understand how many churches see themselves. For many people, the commitment they have with their church is similar to the commitment they have with the local Lion's club (a very fine group of people). This is the social/American view of the church. When we put the church in this perspective, we can understand why those without a Biblical understand of the church would want the church to marry same-sex couples, advocate for gender equality, and promote other agendas that don't necessarily fit within a Biblical concept of the church.

The Bible teaches us a different perspective of the church. It starts out by referencing us as called-out from among the nations. It also refers to the


church as a group of believers in Jesus Christ who meet for local fellowship. As the Body of Christ, the physical embodiment of the kingdom of God in this present world, we are to submit to Jesus' lordship in all areas of life. The church does not exist solely for the benefit of the members or even "potential clients," rather the church exists to exalt Jesus Christ and walk in obedience and love to Him.

Practically, as we walk in obedience to him, we love one another, serve one another, and look out for one another. Acts 20 teaches us that the believers met together to eat together and to listen to teachers tell of Christ. Acts 2 tells us that they joyfully praised God for the work He was doing among them as they would meet together. They would share with one another who had needs as they participated in fellowship with one another. And, God was the one who brought in new "clients."

In considering how the world sees the church and how the Bible sees the church, it is clear that they don't see the function of the church the same. The church isn't a club, a charitable institution, or even an advocate for social causes. That is how the church has been viewed by some in the past but isn't how the Bible describes the church. The church is more like a "kingdom within kingdoms" or a "nation within nations." It operates with a different set of laws and under different leadership. Its politics revolve around Jesus being the Lord of all things and everything being subject to His rule and reign. Its social concerns center on the Gospel of Jesus being available to all people regardless of race, gender or background. The charity of the church centers on Jesus' love for the lost, the broken, the cast-out, and underprivileged. The goal of the church isn't its own growth, but on obedience to Jesus and commitment to His leading.

This side of heaven



A gentle answer

As it does this year, July 4 fell on Sunday in 1937. While Pastor Eldred Johnston led worship that morning in Paulding, Ohio, local kids set off firecrackers nearby (restrictions were rare back then). Realizing he needed to act, the pastor slipped outside during a hymn and found the revelers.

But instead of scolding or shouting, Johnston stayed calm. "I used to enjoy shooting fireworks too," he said, adding that he knew it was a fun way to celebrate. "But many in this town are gathered in worship, and the noise is very distracting. All I'm asking is that you wait until church services are over — about noon — and then shoot firecrackers all you want." The pastor smiled at each youth and returned to church.

Recounting that experience in *Liberty* magazine, Johnston said he half-expected to hear defiant explosions. Instead, the kids waited respectfully until worship was over. When conflicts loom, may we heed that example — and this advice from Proverbs: "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger" (15:1, NIV).
