
IT'S DISTRICTS TIME!

January Mission of the Month—**The Llapushi’s**

Our new missionary family for 2022 is the Llapushi’s from Albania in Europe. Elton (Tony) is the husband and Gresilda is his wife. They have a six year old daughter Holta, and a five year old son Hosea.

The people of Albania are mostly Moslem. From 1960 to 1990, there was a ban on all religions. The mosques, churches and temples became warehouses, arenas, cultural centers, or were destroyed. **Then in the 1990’s the ban was lifted. Albania had the reputation of being the strictest communistic** and foremost atheistic country in the world. There is Islam, Orthodox and Roman Catholic religions as well as a few Biblical Christian churches.

The Llapushi’s work with 15:20 Coalition headquartered in Kentucky. Their motto verse is Romans 15:20. Since 2011, they started three church plants; one in Kosovo and two in Albania.

In October, they held their first baptism with four adults being baptized. They have tried street ministry, handing out literature, built a playground to reach children and prepared food boxes for the poor.

Be of good cheer

U.K. marketers invented Blue Monday as “the best day to book a summer holiday,” and a psychologist they enlisted to help later admitted the saddest-seeming day became a self-fulfilling prophecy.

January may lack the excitement of December, but it doesn’t have to be a letdown. Christmas is over, but Jesus isn’t! No matter the season of the year or our season of life, Christians always have reason for joy: God’s promises of forgiveness and eternal victory. As Jesus says in John 16:33, “In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world” (KJV).

We were rushing to our next destination when yet another traffic light turned red. As usual, I had packed too many tasks into the day. Now we’d be even later. While I stewed in frustration, my son had a completely different reaction to being stopped. “Yes — I love this!” he shouted as we sat. “We’re first in line!”

What an important lesson on perspective. I focused on the negative, but he saw the good in the situation. As Proverbs 15:13 says, “A joyful heart brightens one’s face, but a troubled heart breaks the spirit” (CEB).
